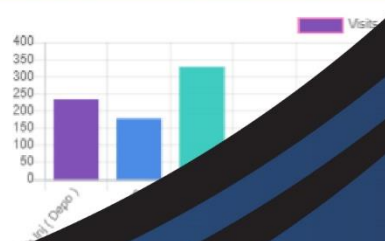
General Health Services - Category Breakdown at Your Facility

Of Contraceptive Logistics Management Information System (cLMIS)

This *User Manual* provides step-by-step instructions for getting started with the Contraceptive Logistics Management Information System (cLMIS). It provides guidelines on application features to manage logistics data for contraceptive products. This user manual is organized according to the logical flow of cLMIS features and describes tasks in the same order users can perform while using this web portal.



Before You Begin...

It is recommended to have a working internet connection for web-access to the cLMIS web portal in order to use it side-by-side when reading this manual.

Background

USAID Pakistan was tasked by the Government of Pakistan with implementing a Logistics Management Information System (LMIS) for contraceptive commodities using a web-based approach to facilitate country-wide data entry without the installation of any specific software. After several months of thorough consultations with all stakeholders from the public and private sectors, the Project adapted and enhanced the web-based application from the international best practices. The LMIS was contextualized to the local stakeholder structure and the devolution of responsibility from the national to the provincial and district level.

The LMIS for contraceptive commodities was launched by the Prime Minister of Pakistan on July 2011 as the public sector's first Logistics Management Information System, later termed as Contraceptive Logistics Management Information System (cLMIS).

LMIS has the flexibility to integrate other health commodities along-with contraceptives. In addition to the public sector, this application is also able to record contraceptives national sales data of the private sector. The system is able to cater the district level reporting of logistics data, by aggregating facility level data through paper-based reports for LHW program, DOH facilities of Pakistan as well as PWD of Balochistan and Regions. The system also provides health facility level reporting for Population Welfare Department (PWD) in three provinces i.e. Punjab, Khyber

Pakhtunkhwa and Sindh. However in a few districts of LHW program and DOH stakeholders, a pilot for facilities-based reporting at the district level is currently going on.

To strengthen reporting and visibility of private sector contraceptives, a district level interface has been incorporated in the cLMIS which will enable provincial and regional health and population departments to see the contribution of the private sector in their respective geographical areas at both the provincial and regional levels.

In order to sustain the usage cLMIS nationwide, the Project trained the government users of the system through the public sector master trainers. The prescribed training provided knowledge and skills required to enter data into the web-based cLMIS.

The Central Warehouse and Supplies (CW&S) is a national repository for contraceptive commodities. All public sector stakeholders at the district level create integrated requisition requests (CLR-6) to the CW&S for contraceptive supplies. The requisition process is now part of the cLMIS which generates CLR-6 based on the reported consumption and stock availability data. The Project is providing the transportation support from CW&S to the district stores.

The cLMIS data visibility plays a significant role in improving stock monitoring at the district and sub-district level. Therefore, timely and accurate data entry and submission of monthly reports at the district level are critical to the functioning of the cLMIS. The data collected from the LMIS can then subsequently be used at each level of the supply chain to enhance informed decision making to meet service delivery demands.

The 2010 population policy clearly emphasizes the importance of operationally effective logistics management information system (LMIS). The paper-based logistics information system was unable to accurately track the contraceptive stock status at various levels of the supply chain from CWH to the facility level. Inaccurate reporting data resulted in unrealistic forecasting and procurement inefficiencies when working within the whole logistics system. In identifying the need for accurate essential logistics data for decision making, Ministry of National Health Services, Regulations and Coordination (MoNHSR&C) requested the Project to replace the paper-based system to ensure an effective contraceptive supply chain.

The USAID is providing technical assistance to MoNHSR&C to strengthen the logistics system and improve overall supply chain management. During the years 2008-2009, a series of consultative meetings were held between the Ministry and USAID to assess the requirements of the MoNHSR&C. One of the most important areas which require immediate attention is improved data visibility to ensure improved product availability.

There are different vertical programs in public health with varying commodity distribution systems for products such as lab equipment, anti-TB drugs and other essential medicines in addition to contraceptives. The verticality of the health system poses a unique challenge in Pakistan because of the varying systems implemented in public healthcare program. Another complexity includes the fact that some systems are operating under a pull system whereas others are referred to a push system to deliver products.



Some programs distribute directly from the central warehouse to the district stores such as for contraceptive while others flow through different supply chain levels. There are linkages among various stakeholders at national, provincial and district levels for requisition, delivery and storage of contraceptives. Any LMIS intended to provide national level stock status and consumption data must accommodate all stakeholders and their linkages.

At the public sector level, there are three main stakeholders; Ministry of National Health Services, Regulations and Coordination (MoNHSR&C), Population Welfare Departments in each province and region and Departments or Directorates of Health in each province and region. Mainly, there are three primary healthcare components of DOH which includes; Static Health Facilities, Lady Health Workers (LHW) program and Mother & Neo-natal Child Healthcare (MNCH) program.

A key stakeholder within DOH is the National Program for Family Planning and Primary Health Care which is a vertical program implanted through eight provincial project implementation unit (PPIUs) and district project implementation units (DPIU) at the district level. Although there are vertical programs in DOH at the provincial levels, these programs are functionally integrated at the district level. However, a reasonably good level of coordination exists between the Health and Population Welfare Departments.

Reporting Structure

Population Welfare Department (PWD)

The figure below illustrates the reporting structure of PWD. All Service Delivery Points (SDPs) report to their respective district/area/agency and the DPWO compiles as well as sends the CLR-15 report to provincial/regional headquarters. Each Provincial/Regional Headquarter and ICT prepares the CLR-11, which is then sent to the Federal office for preparation of the monthly contraceptive performance report. The CWH in Karachi sends the CLR-8 monthly for review at the federal level. The CWH in Karachi sends the CLR-8 monthly for review at the federal level. The CLR-8 provides stock status of commodities lying in CWH.

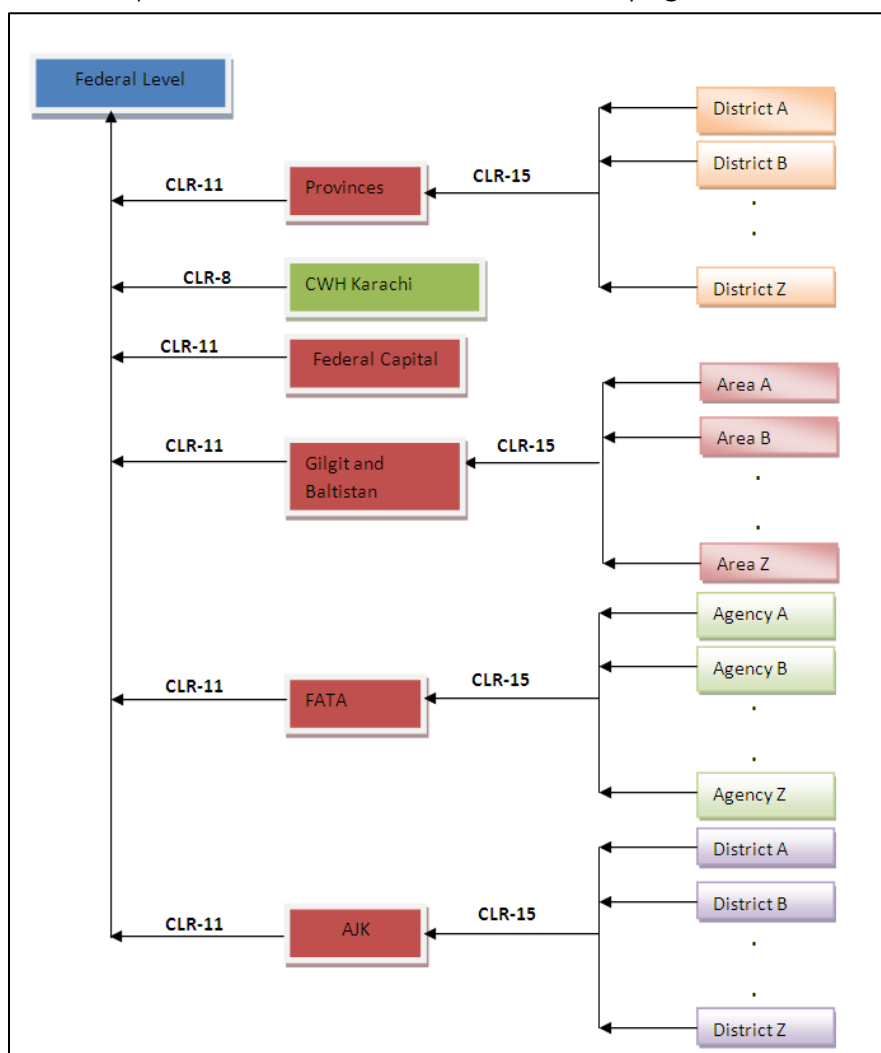


Figure-1: A Flowchart showing flow of data from district to federal level in Population Welfare Department.

The following facilities are being managed by the District Population Welfare Department which provides contraceptives and supervises activities of following service delivery points:

1. FHC (Family Health Clinic) / RHS-A (Reproductive Health Services – A)

2. FWC (Family Welfare Center)
3. RHS-B (Reproductive Health Services – B)
4. MSU (Mobile Service Unit)
5. Social Mobilizers
6. PLDs (Provincial Line Department Outlets)
7. RMPs (Registered Medical Practitioners)
8. Hakeems (Traditional healers using mostly herbal remedies)
9. Homeopaths
10. DDPs (District Distribution Points)
11. TBA (Traditional Birth Attendants)
12. Counters

Lady Health Workers (LHW) Program

The LHW program has eight (8) regions called Provincial Project Implementation Units (PPIU) and at the district level, it has District Project Implementation Units (DPIU). The DPIU is responsible for providing contraceptives to LHWs.

The eight Provincial Project Implementation Units are:

1. Peshawar (for Khyber Pakhtunkhwa)
2. FATA secretariat (based in Peshawar, providing services to FATA)
3. Lahore (for Punjab)
4. Hyderabad (for Sindh)
5. Quetta (for Baluchistan)
6. Muzaffarabad (for AJK)
7. Gilgit (for Gilgit and Baltistan)
8. Islamabad (for federal capital territory)

Department of Health (DOH)

The Department of Health currently receives all supplies from CWH. The district DOH store provides contraceptives to static health facilities and reports family planning data through District Health Information System (DHIS) on a monthly basis.

Users and User Roles

This chapter explains the overview and user roles of Logistics Management Information System. The web-based application LMIS system is contextualized to fit the local stakeholder structure and the devolution of health and population programs of provincial governments. The system brings in district-level reporting by aggregating facility-level data through paper-based reports. With a unified system for reporting and requisitioning, the LMIS system is able to integrate information from all levels and sectors. The web-based LMIS can be accessed at <http://lmis.gov.pk>.

In order to log on to the system, the user requires a username and password. Once successfully logged in, the user is directed to the relevant dashboard and is able to obtain LMIS data and reports, users are defined by the role they have in the public health supply chain. For example, Population Welfare Department users work under Provincial PWD and District Population Welfare Officer. Similarly for the Lady Health Workers' program, the users are authorized personnel from District Program Implementation Unit (DPIU) and Provincial Program Implementation Unit (PPIU).

The following table includes the activities that various users will be able to perform once they login: *Stakeholder and level specific activities users can perform in the cLMIS.*

User Roles

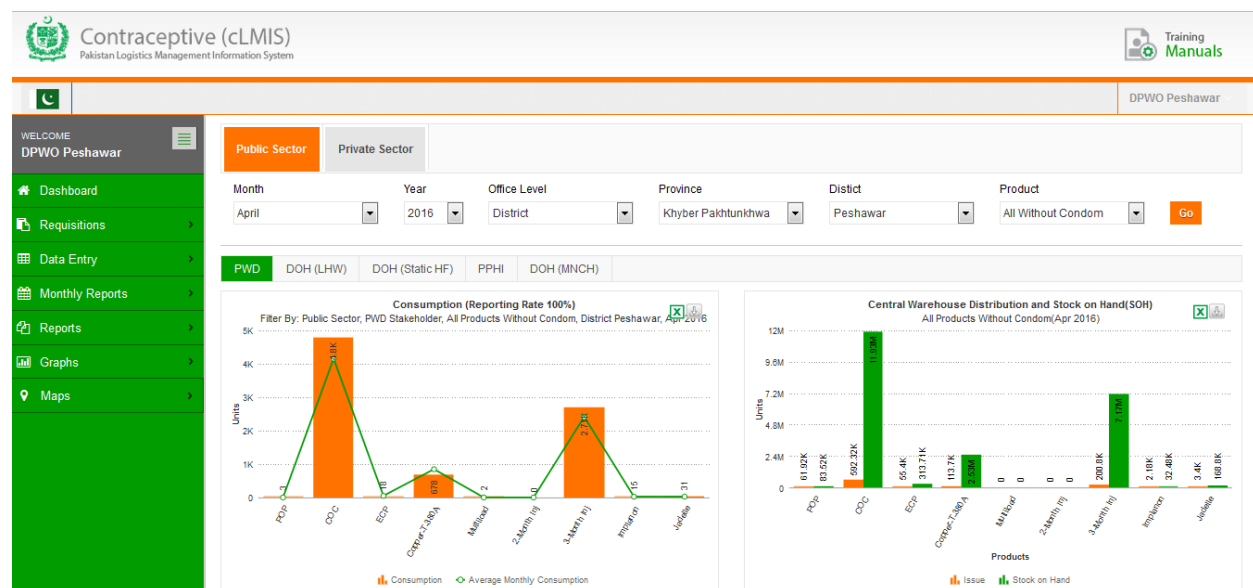
This chapter explains the step-by-step instructions for using the dashboard features on the Contraceptive Logistics Management Information system.

Introduction

The Dashboard is a visual display of the most important analysis. It can be used to achieve multiple objectives and is arranged on a single screen so the information can be viewed at a glance.

Users can view following the following dashboards headings by default:

- Public Sector Stakeholders
- Private Sector Stakeholders



Public Sector Dashboard

This dashboard allows users to quickly view analysis in a graphical manner for the selected public sector stakeholder.

- **Stock Out vs Over Stock**

This graph shows the stock out and over stock rates in district/sub-district (field) stores for different products. This also shows the reporting rate on which this analysis is drawn.

- **Stock Issued vs Stock on Hand (SOH) in Central Warehouse**

This graph shows the comparison between the issued stock and stock on hand (SOH) for all products in the central warehouse.

- **Consumption vs Average Monthly Consumption (AMC)**

This graph compares the consumption and average monthly consumption of all contraceptive products for the selected stakeholder and also shows the reporting rate on which this analysis is drawn.

- **Couple Year Protection (CYP)**

This graph shows the Couple Years of Protection (CYP) for the selected month for each contraceptive product.

Users can apply following filters.

- **Month:** select the month from the drop-down list
- **Year:** select the year from the drop-down list.
- **Office Level:** select the Office Level from the drop-down list.
- **Province:** select the Province from the drop-down list.
- **District:** select the district for which you want to view report.
- **Product:** users can either select all products with or without condoms because the logistic analysis of condoms changes the maximum range of graphs to a level where analysis of other products is not shown properly.

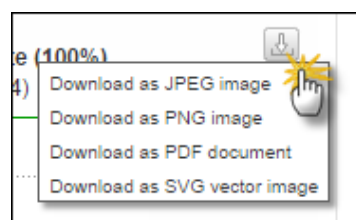
Click **Go** to view Public Sector Dashboard.

Stock Out vs Over Stock

The Public Sector dashboard shows the stock out and over stock rates in district/sub-district (field) stores for different products. This also shows the reporting rate on which this analysis is drawn. 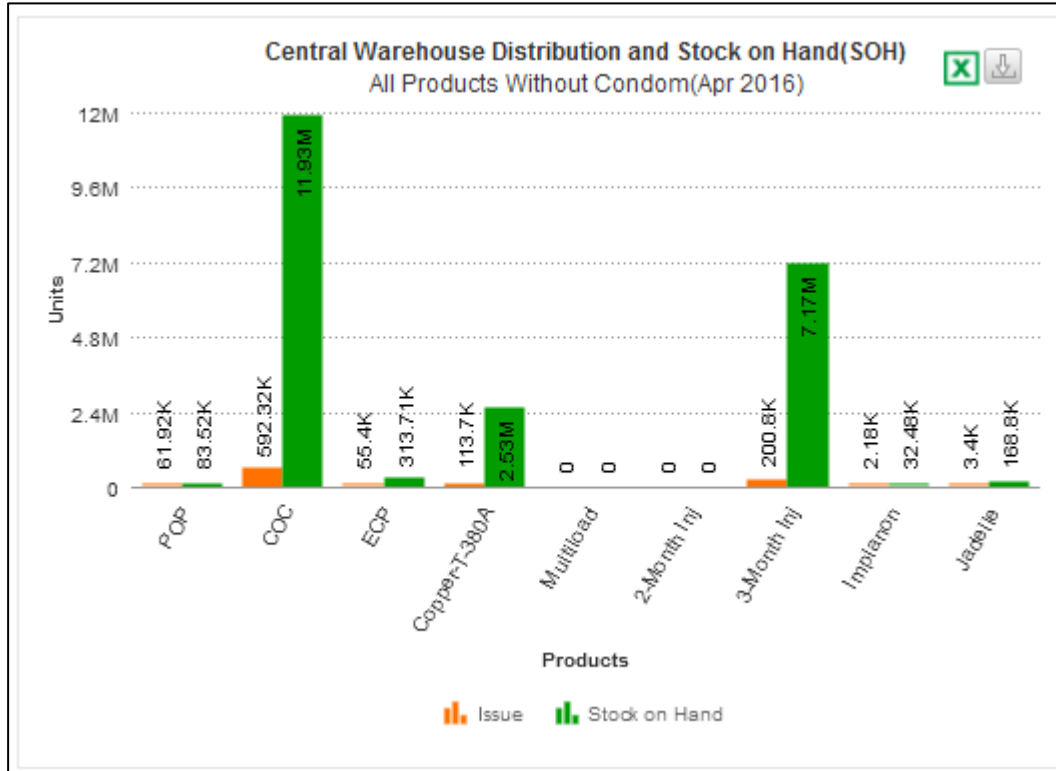

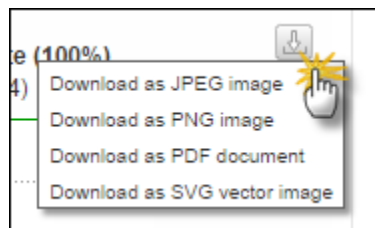

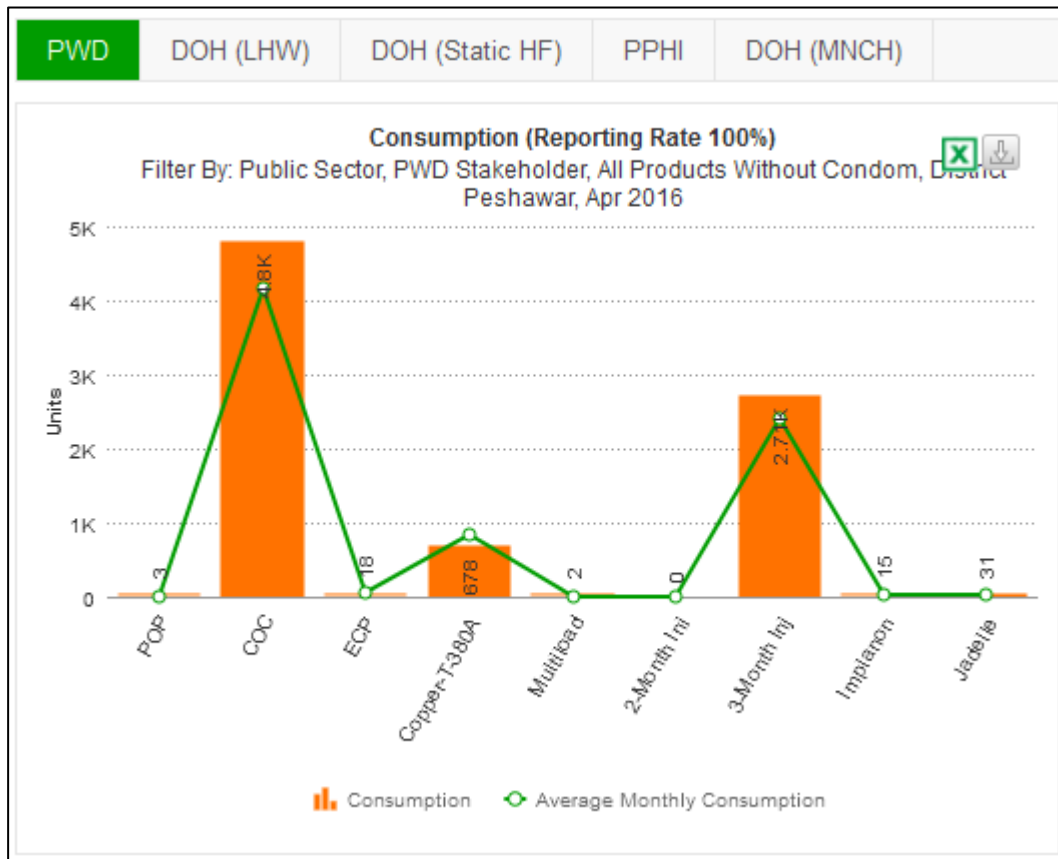

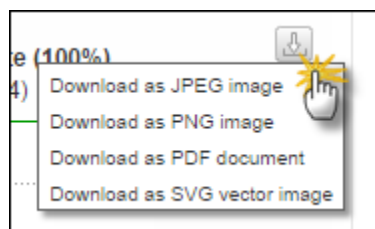

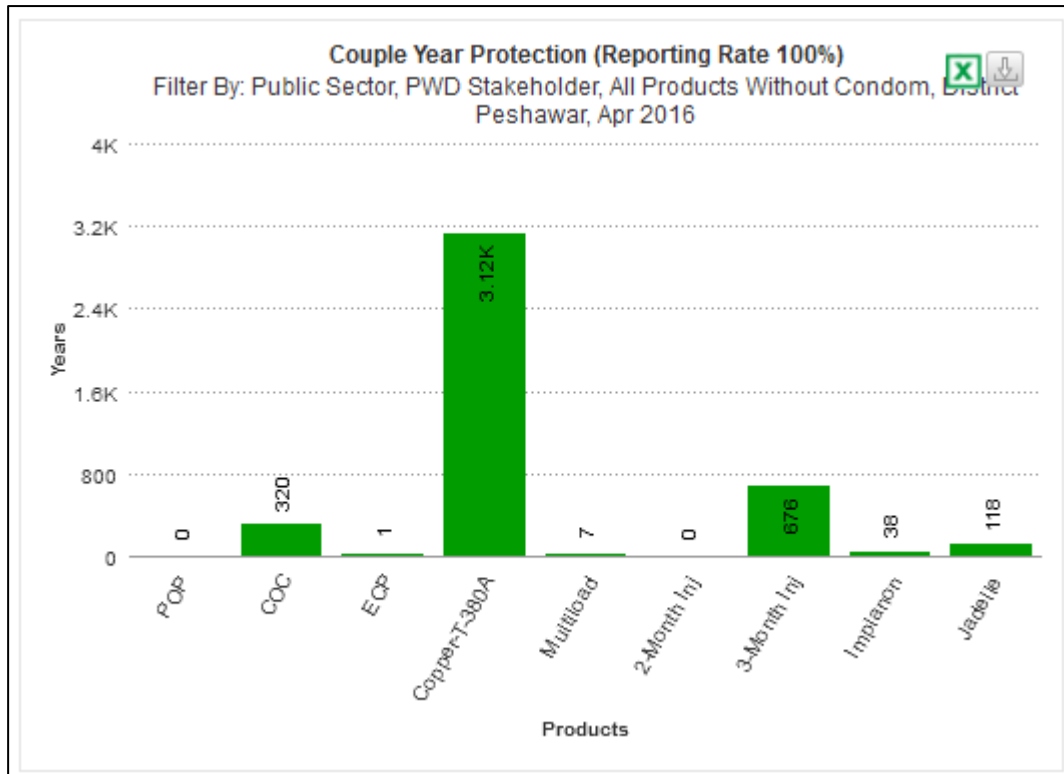

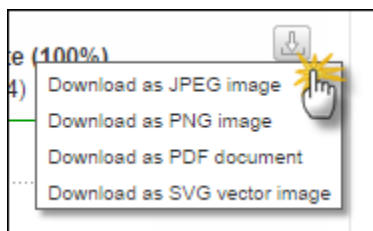

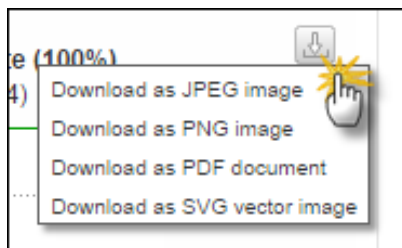

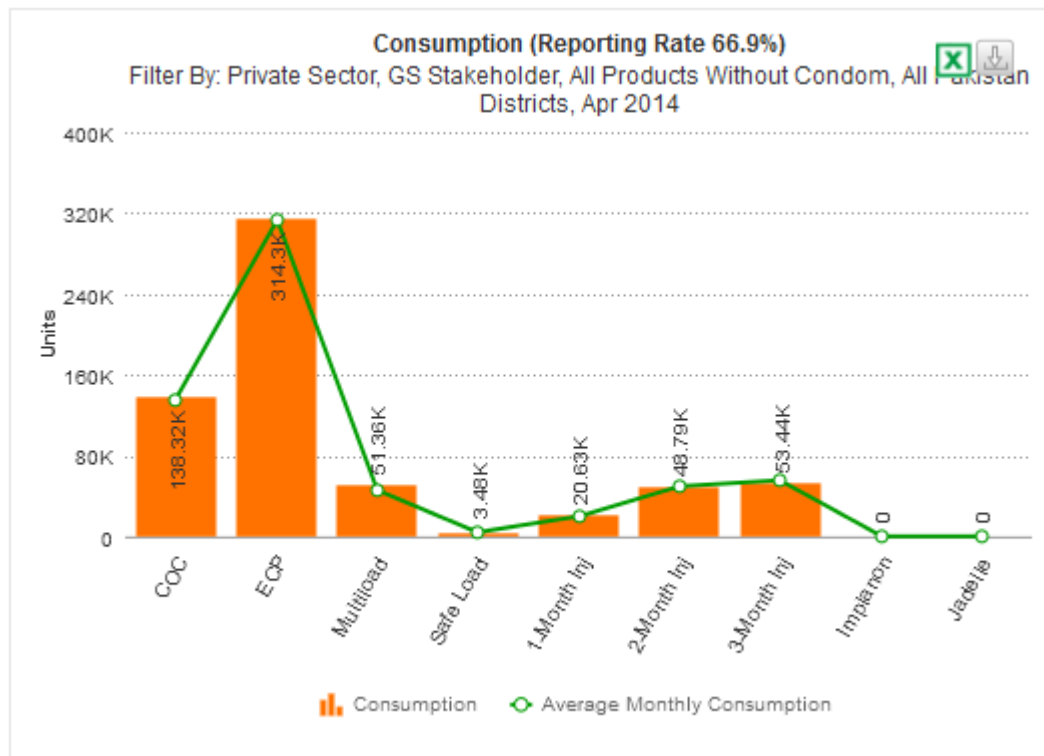

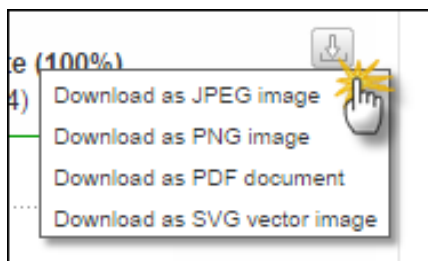

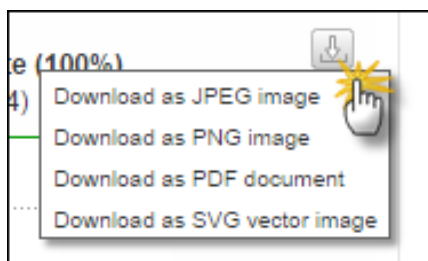

Background of FP Executive Dashboard

The Contraceptives Logistics Management Information System is a fully functional, Government of Pakistan owned web-based Logistics Management Information System (LMIS) (<http://lmis.gov.pk>) that manages the logistics management of FP commodities in Pakistan. It also provides business intelligence that leaders at various levels can utilize to inform policies and decisions. The USAID funded Global Health Supply Chain – Procurement & Supply Management (GHSC-PSM) project created a Family Planning Executive Dashboard as a step towards ensuring commodity security through use of cLMIS data for policy, procurement planning, financing, and stock monitoring decision making and to ensure evidence-based decisions around contraceptive stock sufficiency up to the service delivery point (SDP)/health facility level.

The GHSC-PSM project, in collaboration with the Population Program Wing / Ministry of National Health Services, Regulations & Coordination, organized a one-day session on 8th February 2018 in Lahore to launch and introduce the Family Planning (FP) Executive Dashboard to all of the Secretaries and relevant Director Generals of provincial Departments of Health and Population Welfare Departments.

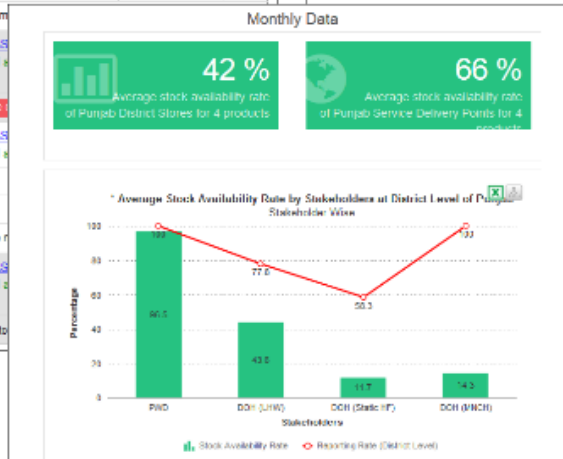
One outcome from the orientation session was the decision that the GHSC-PSM program would create a user guide for FP Executive Dashboard that will help in understanding the use of the dashboard for the relevant users today and in the future to institutionalize this knowledge.

Salient Features of the FP Executive Dashboard

The prominent features of the FP Executive Dashboard include:

- The Executive Dashboard has the capability to generate “advisories” addressed to appropriate senior level officers at the provincial and district levels where SDP stocks have gone below the agreed-upon levels posing risk of stock-out.
- The Dashboard focuses on engaging higher levels of management for their intervention at appropriate times to ensure action throughout the supply chain hierarchy. Below are recent screen shots from the FP Dashboard.

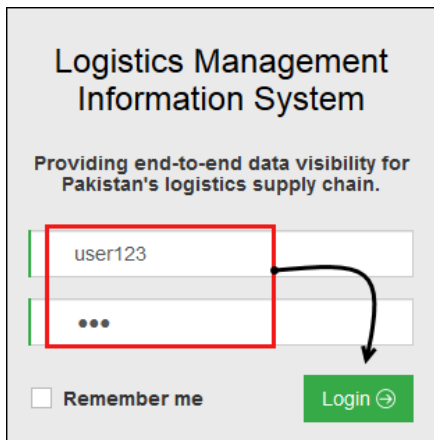
FP Executive Dashboard Overview

The FP Executive Dashboard has been developed to provide an overview of stock sufficiency of family planning commodities for all four provinces, relevant districts and Service Delivery Points (SDP) / health facilities. In each province, health and population welfare departments are the main consumer of FP commodities and in some provinces like Sindh and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, both departments are procuring jointly with storage at the Central Warehouse & Supplies (CWS), Karachi. The dashboard also enables users to drill down to a particular commodity stock situation at the SDP level for deeper insight into commodity stock levels.

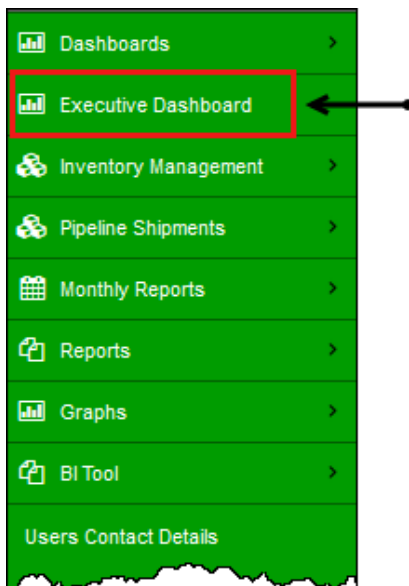
Working with the FP Executive Dashboard

To open the Executive Dashboard:

1. Go to www.lmis.gov.pk.
2. Log into the LMIS account using your provided credentials.



3. After logging in, click **Executive Dashboard** on the left side menu.



The Executive Dashboard will then display.

Upon loading, the dashboard displays on the left and is a real time stock situation at the CWS, Karachi, as on the current date, in the Transactional Data table. Please note that districts and health facilities data reporting is compiled monthly, therefore, the stock data of districts and health facilities on the right will be displayed in the

next month, e.g., data related to March will be displayed in April after data entry is completed.

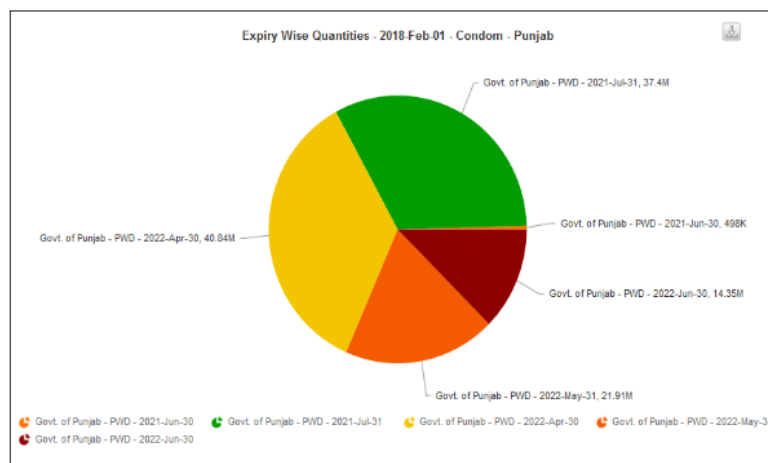

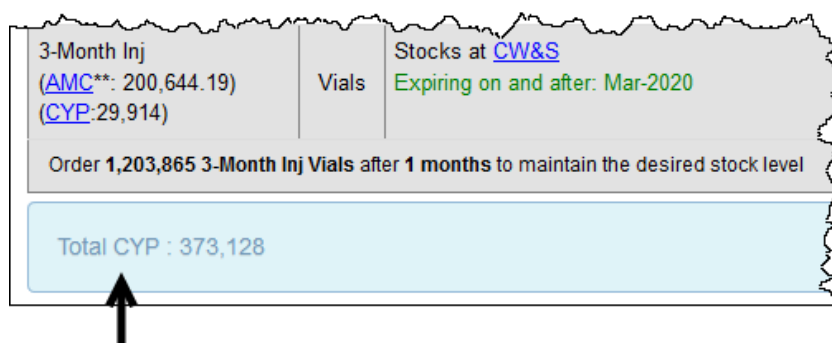

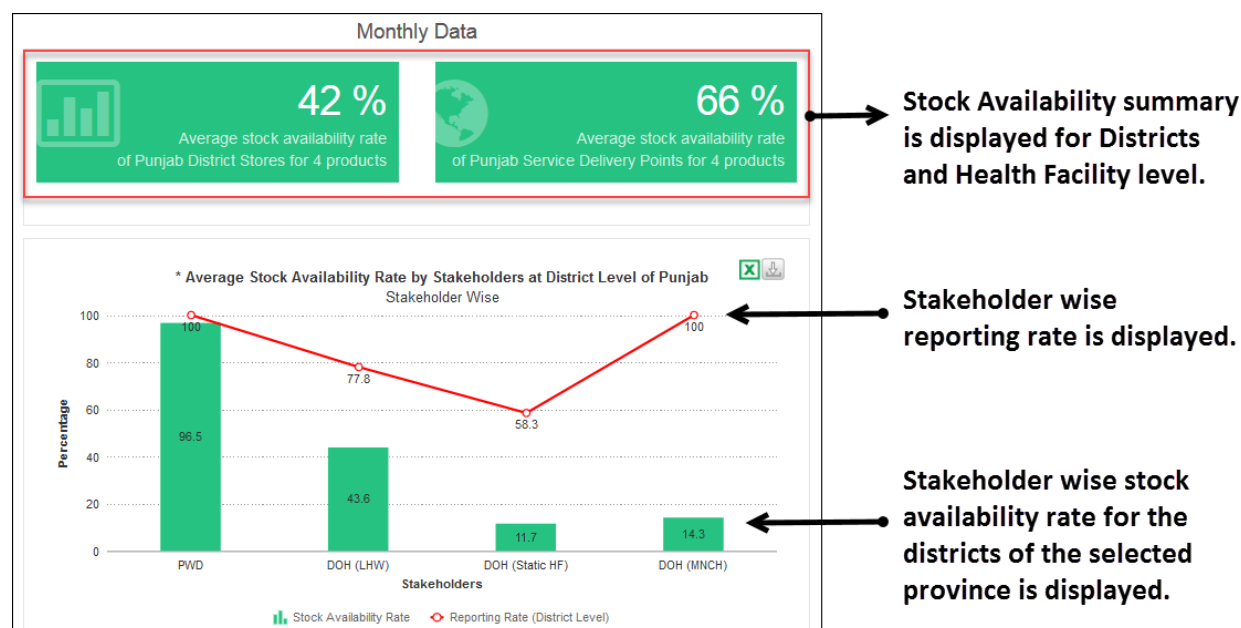

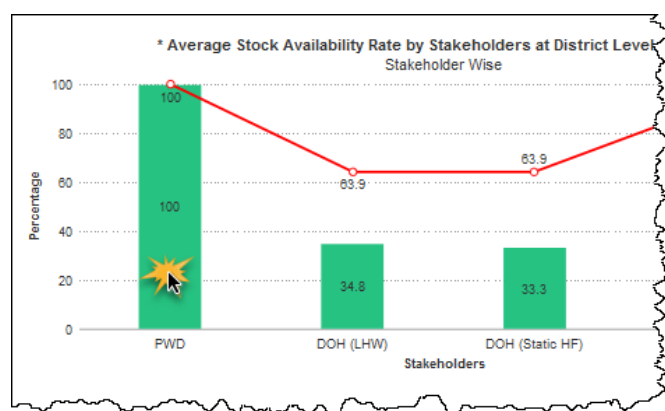

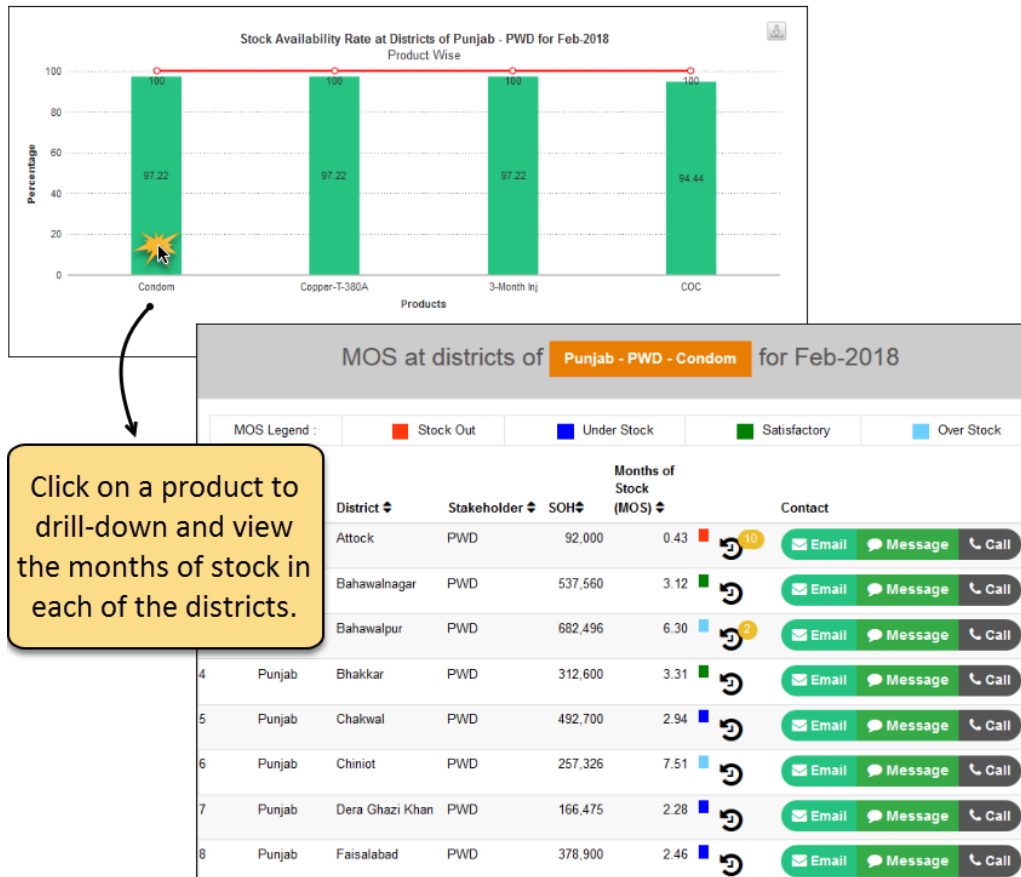

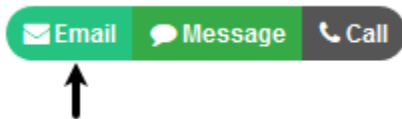

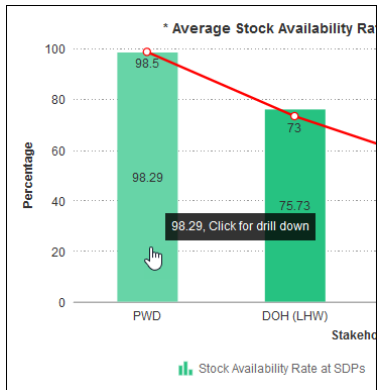

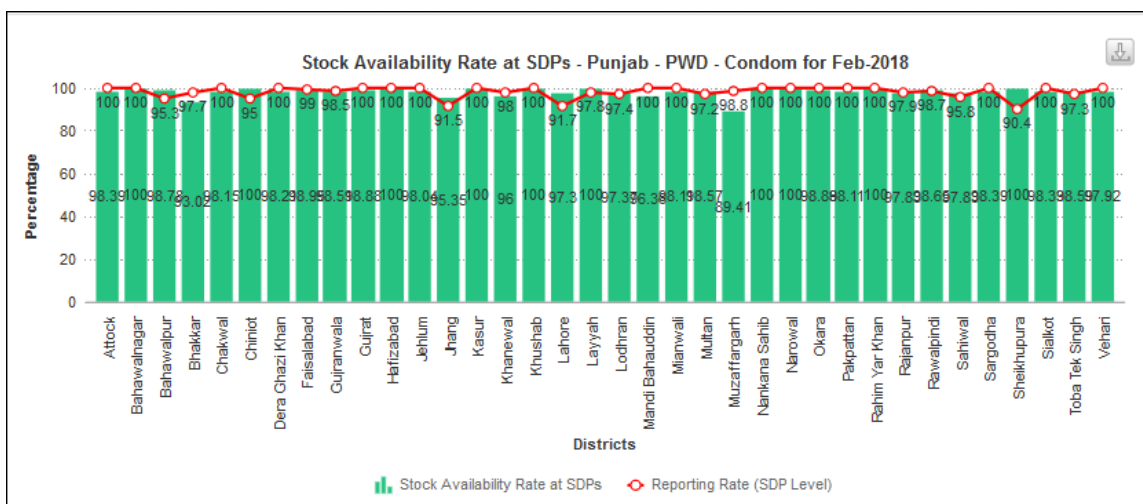

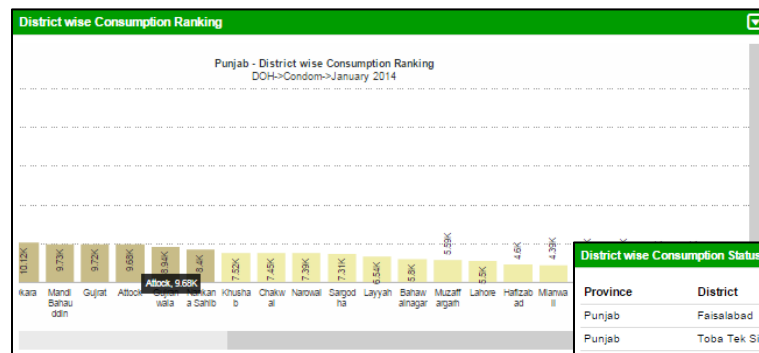
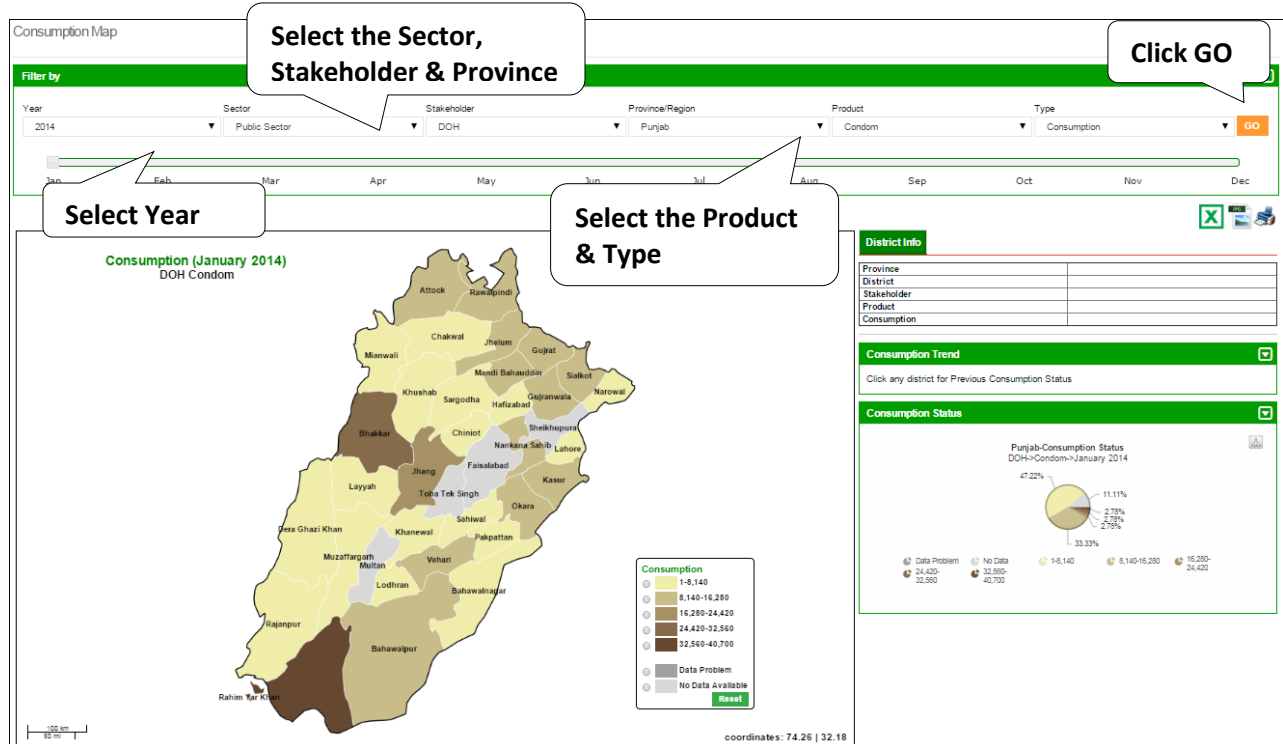
Month of Stock Map

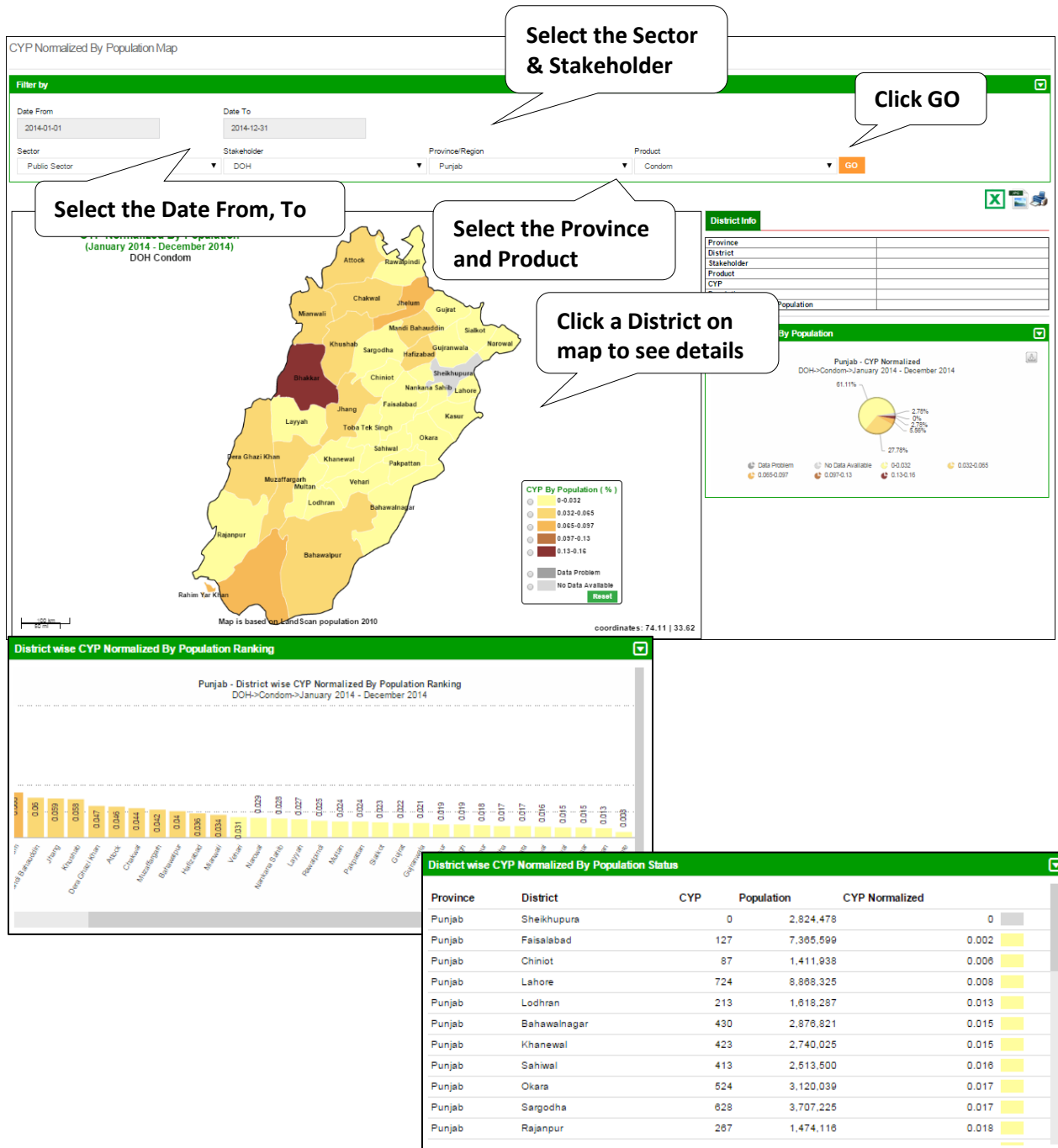

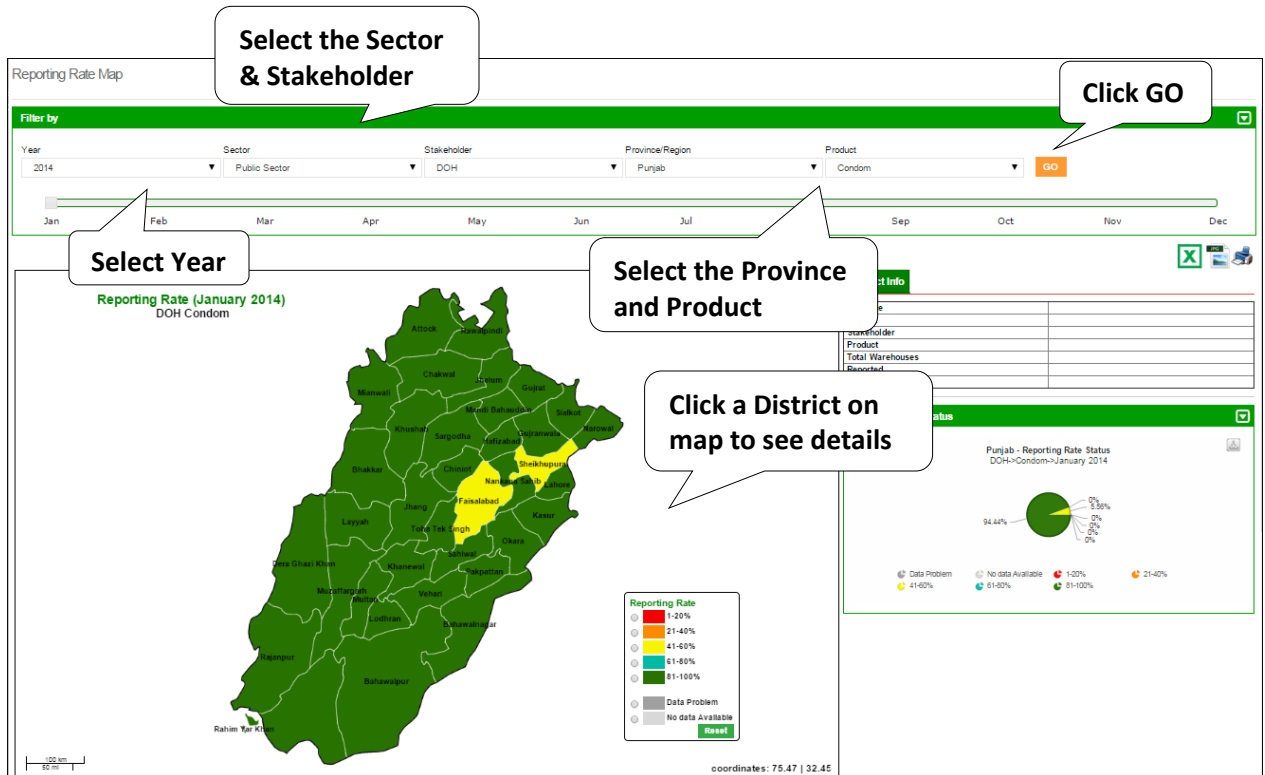
CYP by Population Map

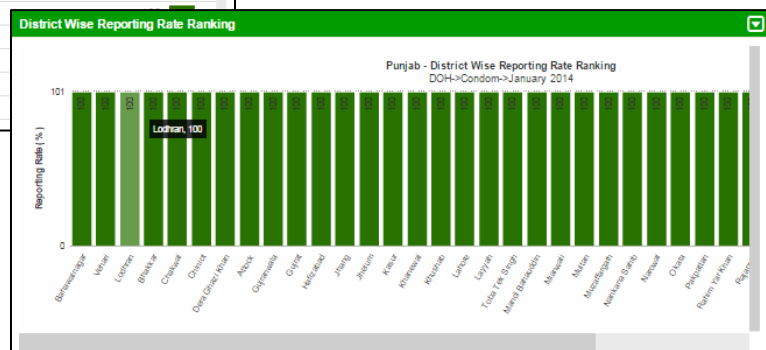


Reporting Rate Map

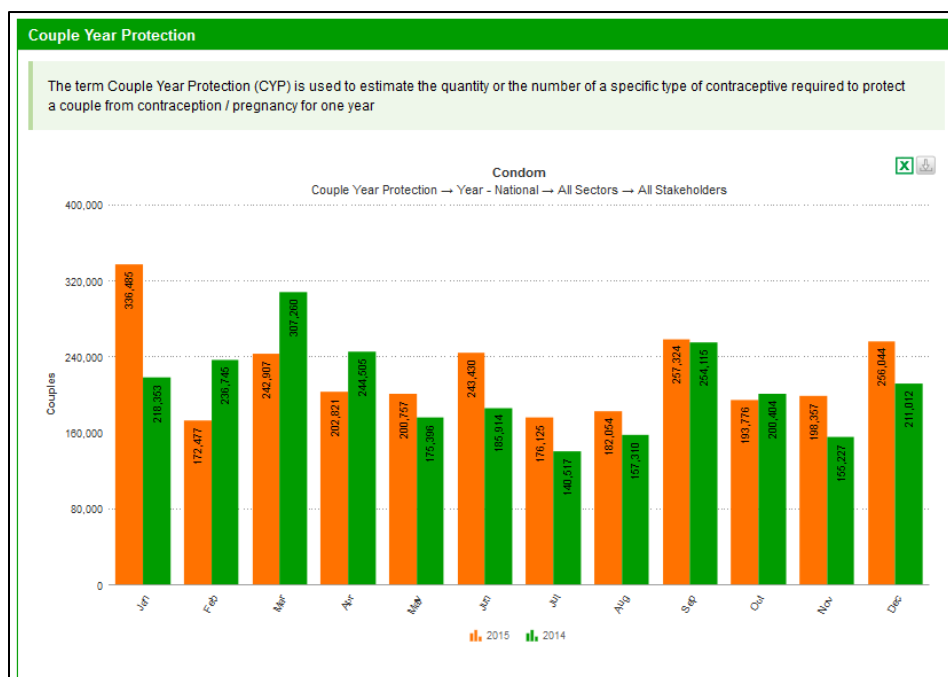

Requisitions

EDO (H) uses the Stock Requisitions form to request commodities from CW&S. EDO (H) staff prepares this requisition form on a quarterly basis in consultation with the storekeeper. This form indicates the stock status and consumption during the quarter and indicates the quantity request for each contraceptive being used in respective districts.

The district store users were required to fill out Requisition (CLR-6) based on the previous consumption of that district and submit to the Central Warehouse. However, in Release-2 of cLMIS, Requisition (CLR-6) is auto generated using previous consumption trends for the required quantity of products for the next quarter.



New Requisition

The New Requisition (CLR-6) auto-fills the fields by using previous consumption data of a district in a selected quarter. This form was previously filled by the requester. District users can create requisitions and electronically submit them to the central warehouse. These requisitions will be reviewed by the central warehouse management and stock will be issued as per availability and approved.

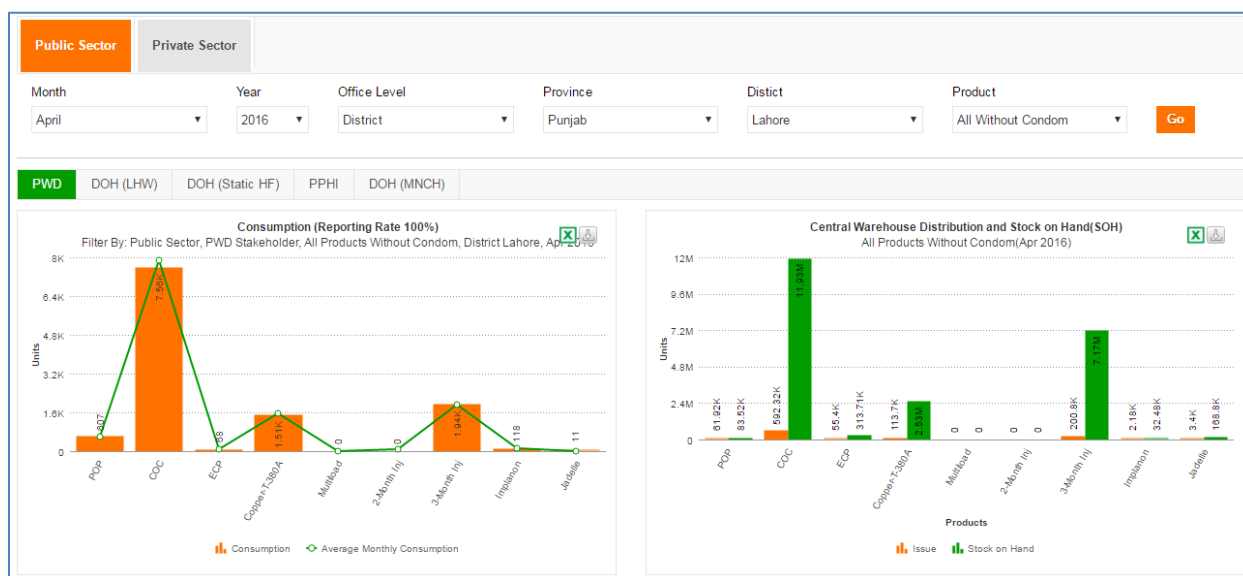
in Contraceptive Logistics Management Information System

This section explains the tasks that the authenticated users at PWD district level can perform while using Logistics Management Information System for contraceptives.

In order to log on to the system, the PWD user will be allocated a username and password. Once successfully logged in, the user will be directed to a 'user information' page specific to the organization. This page will contain specific information about the user's department or organization.

In order to obtain LMIS data and reports, the PWD user must successfully login with his/her username and password. System users are defined by relevant stakeholders and the level in the supply chain they represent. After a successful login, the user will be directed to their stakeholder specific page. - Month of Stock

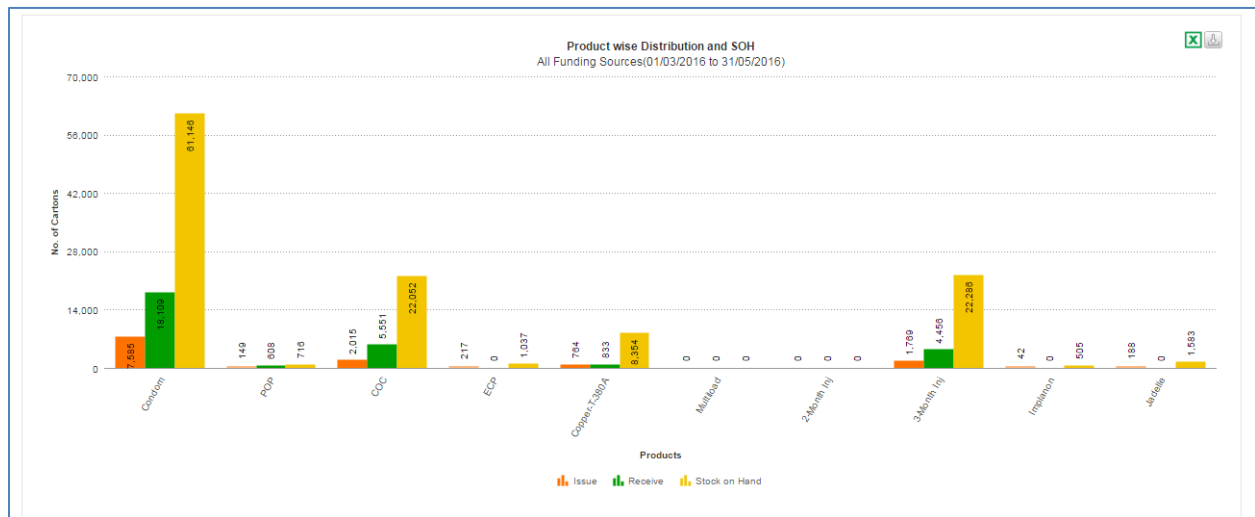

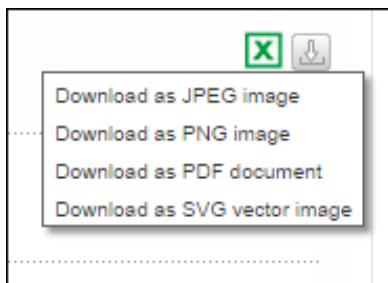

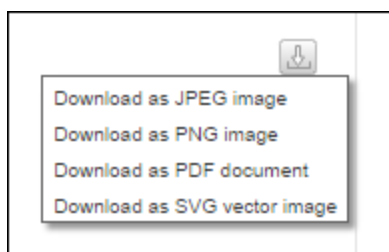

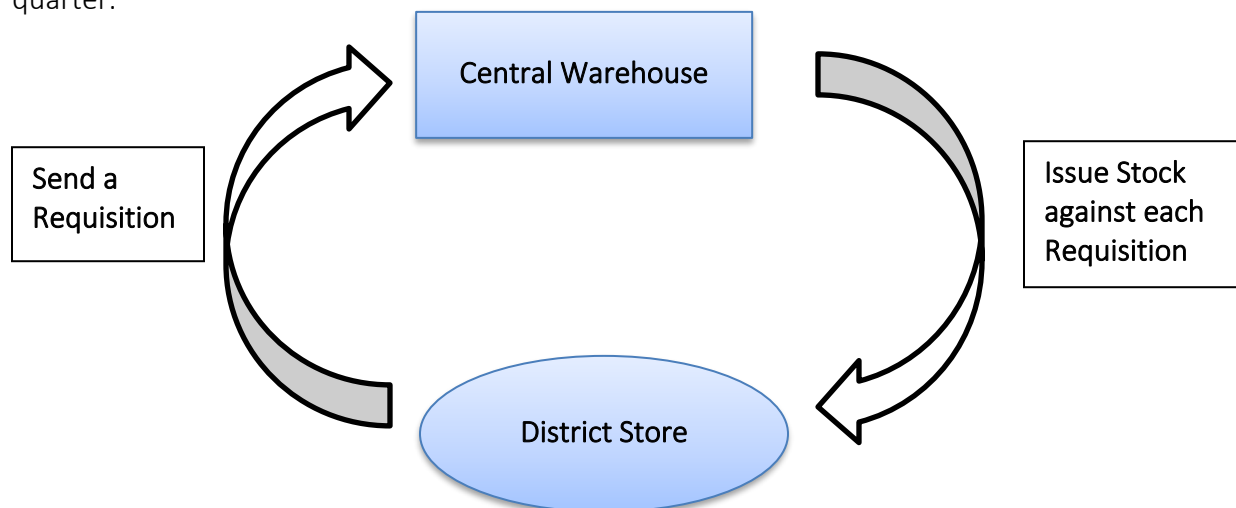
Requisitions

The Requisition form is used by district staff to request commodities from CW&S. District staff prepares this requisition form on quarterly basis in consultation with the storekeepers. This form indicates the stock status and consumption during the quarter and indicates the quantity requested for each contraceptive being used in each respective districts.

The Central warehouse can manage requisition requests placed by the district stores or facilities. The user at the central warehouse can approve these requisition requests.

Requisition Requests (CLR-6)

The district store places a Requisition Request (New CLR-6) based on the previous consumption of that district and submits it to the Central Warehouse. This Requisition Request (CLR-6) is auto generated using previous consumption trends for the required quantity of products for the next quarter.



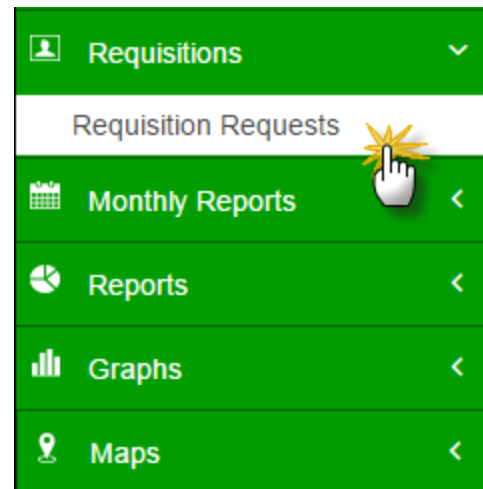

Inventory Management

Inventory Management is a component of supply chain management and supervises the flow of goods from suppliers to warehouses and from these facilities to the districts and ultimately to the point of sale. One of the key functions of inventory management is to keep a detailed records of each new or returned product as it enters or leaves a warehouse or the point of sale.

Inventory Management features enable the Store Users to manage the inventory for the Central Warehouse. Store Users can perform the following tasks:

- **Stock Receive from Supplier:** Central user can receive stock directly from suppliers.
- **Stock Receive from Warehouse:** Central user can also receive stock from other warehouses.
- **Stock Receive Search:** Central user can search the received stock from other warehouses or suppliers.
- **Stock Issue:** The stock is issued to other warehouses and stores on demand.
- **Stock Issue Search:** Central user can search the stock issued to other warehouses.

- **Batch Management:** When stock is received, the user marks the batches with the latest expiry date as 'Running', so that this stock can be issued first.
- **Stock Adjustments:** If stock is lost or recovered, users can add adjustments in the cLMIS.
- **Search Adjustments:** User can search the added adjustments for a selected duration.
- **Manage Locations:** User can also manage the location of stock within the warehouse.
- **Location Status:** User can check the stock available at a particular location in the warehouse and transfer it to another location.
- **Stock Pick:** User can select the Issue No. to pick a particular product from the voucher list.
- **Bin Card:** User can view the products related to the searched bin card.

Stock Receive (Supplier)

User at the Central level can receive stock directly from the supplier. Users can also add information such as Funding Source, Product, Manufacturer, Batch No, Expiry Date and Quantity of the required product.

Specify the following information:

- **Receipt No:** is an automatically generated number for identifying the receive transaction.
- **Ref No:** specify the receive reference.
- **Received Date:** Click on Receive date to expand the date picker tool and select the date.
- **Receive From:** Select the supplier for the product.
- **Product:** select the product from the list.
- **Manufacturer:** select or add the manufacturer for the selected product.
- **Batch No:** specify the batch number for the product.
- **Expiry Date:** Click on Expiry date to expand the date picker tool, or type-in the required date using format dd/mm/yyyy.
- **Quantity:** Add the received quantity for the selected product.

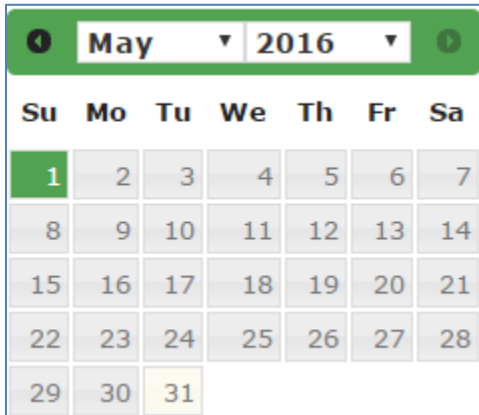

Batch Management

Once the stock is received at a warehouse, each package is identified by its Batch Number and Expiry Date. Each batch is sorted by its expiry date by the rule of “First Expiry First Out”. When batches of stock are added to the cLMIS, the account user usually assigns the batches with latest (nearest expiry) expiry date as ‘Running’. The running batches are issued first. The cLMIS provides a section for batch management of each product. Each batch will have a status i.e. Running, Stacked, and Finished. Central users will be able to change the status of batches as desired.

Stock can be issued only if their batch status is set to Running by the system. One or more batches can be set to running depending on the quantity and expiry date of the product.

The system provides a summary of batches of each product with a total quantity.

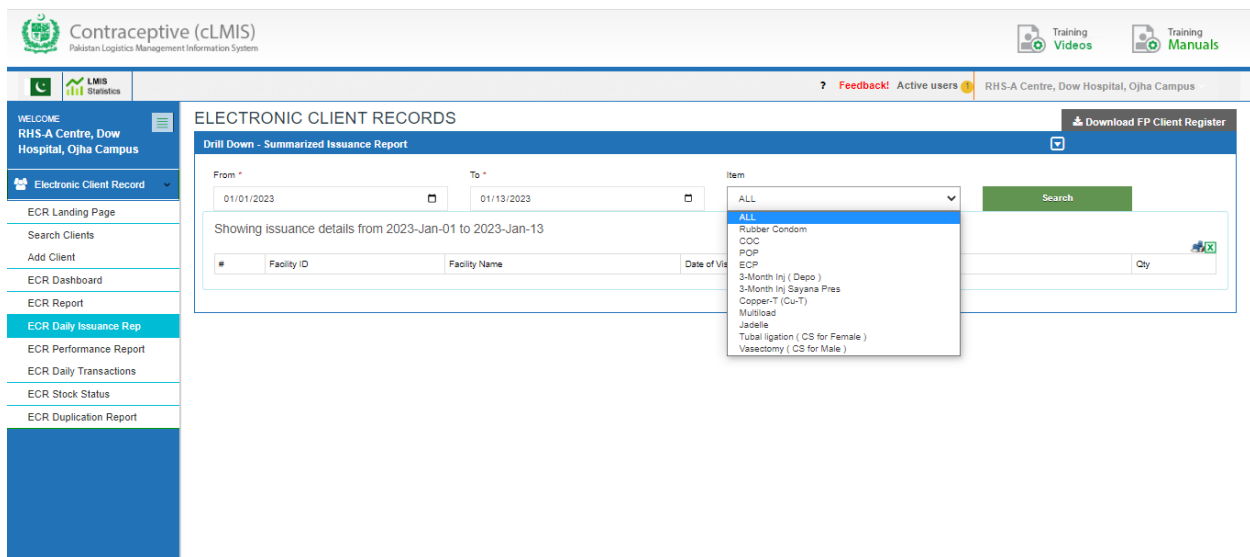
